

The Invisible Life of Addie La Rue by V.E. Schwab

I'm blown away by the story and the beautiful language in this book. In early 1700's rural France, Addie, attempting to avoid a forced marriage, unwittingly makes a deal with The Darkness. And then must live with the unexpected consequences of their arrangement for centuries. I've been listening to this as an audiobook in my car and I'm tempted to arrange a long road trip just so I can finish it.

One Day in December by Josie Silver

My editor told me to read The Two Lives Of Lydia Bird as she saw some similarities to my own work, and also thought I'd enjoy it. It was my first 5-star read of 2022. My next Josie Silver book is this beautiful love story. It's Christmas and Laurie's on a bus, when her eyes meet those of a young man on the side of the road, and in that instant something special happens. She desperately begins a search, hoping to find "bus boy" but when she does, it's not how she expected. Not only is this the story of two people and their journey to find each other, it's also the story of an amazing friendship between Laurie and her flatmate Sarah. Another 5-star read. My only regret is that I've finished it. It's one of those books that I'll read again.

Go Tell The Bees That I Am Gone by Diana Gabaldon

Well if you've read my work you must have guessed that I love a bit of time travel! And I love Diana Gabaldon. I first started reading her books thirty years ago. More recently, she inspired me to start writing. This is the 9th book in the Outlander series and I'm still only a third of the way through but intend to finish it this month (in between watching season 6 of the tv series). We are back on Frasers' Ridge and this book has a lovely comfortable feel about it, like visiting old friends. There are some new characters and of course the American War of Independence is still simmering away in the background. At just on 900 pages, like all of Diana's books it's not for the fainthearted, but persevering with them is time well spent.

It's March madness at my place




