


October News & Musings with Caroline

My October reading has been fabulous! And it continues...

After burying myself in the beautiful but angsty romance books I love for months, this month I've dived back into some romcoms. I started with **Tessa**

Bailey's It Happened One Summer and Hook Line And Sinker.

These are all over social media and I can see why. Tessa's books deliver the promised mix of fun, love, and a big dollop of steam. After that I've been on a **Casey McQuiston** blitz. **Red, White And Royal Blue**, despite the unlikely premise of an enemies to lovers plot between the son of a US President and an English prince, is hands down one of my favourite books this year. For a real treat check it out on audiobook as well. Only five chapters in but I'm loving listening. The second book of hers I recommend is **One Last Stop.** Quirky characters in a New York setting, add in *a time anomaly!*—and I was hooked.

One thing I am working on is creating Spotify playlists for my books—yes, I will share eventually. Another writer friend who does the same sent me a song for a chapter of her work in progress. **Falling Like The Stars** by **James Arthur** is so beautiful and listening to it sent me down a rabbithole of James Arthur songs. Where have I been that I've never heard his music till now?

I've been in a rewatch mood with films: **Notting Hill, Bohemian Rhapsody, Eurovision: Fire Saga** to name a few. But a much-loved series **Derry Girls** has returned. Its brand of humour particularly appeals to this former Catholic girls school student.



Launch week for *Tangled Paths* went smoothly with only one or two technical glitches that were swiftly sorted out by the wonderful support team. And of course my very important ARC team have been on board and it's been so rewarding to get messages from them and see reviews. Little notes like this make my heart sing: "I absolutely loved this book! So glad I found you." I'm glad I've found these people too.

I've been also doing some alpha and beta reading for other authors. It's one of those situations where you get back as much as you give. Reading

other people's work, especially at the draft stage, helps you hone your craft. I have some fabulous conversations with authors about choices we are making in our writing. And I get to enjoy their creativity with a sneak peek into their WIP.

Now I'm back in my happy place, deep into my next book *Tangled Hearts*, I'm reminded of why I write. That all-consuming feeling of characters and story weaving together in an intricate dance is magic. Over the next couple of months I'll start to share some of the story with you. I can't wait for you to meet Layla, Will and Finn: three young people desperate to escape the constraints of their families, and all connected in ways they could never imagine.
