I couldn't help but feature another book from **Chloe Liese**. I have become a firm fan of her Bergman series. In **With You Forever** we get to meet the oldest Bergman, artist Axel, who never thought love was for him. He's proven very wrong. I loved the message in this story that we all feel and express love in different ways, and all are valid. I realised while reading this one that I didn't warn you: Chloe's

books are quite spicy—tastefully done but the level of detail in these scenes might not be to everyone's taste. I'm also enjoying **K.A. Tucker's** series set in Alaska. **Wild at Heart** follows Calla and Jonah from Book 1 after their decision to stay together. And my final pick is

the very witty **Boyfriend Material** by **Alexis Hall**. If you loved **Red, White & Royal Blue**, then this should appeal.

Some long-awaited television has arrived. The second season of **Good Omens** is here, showing the incredible creativity of Neil Gaiman and Terry Pratchett. Brought to life by two favourite actors, David Tennent and Michael Sheen, it's a fun and quirky watch. Another that fits that description is a strange and entertaining Australian comedy/police drama/murder mystery mash-up called **Deadloch**. I'm loving hilarious season one, although be warned—you need a fairly high tolerance for bad language. My other long-awaited watch is season two of **Men In Kilts**. Outlander actors Sam Heughan and Graham McTavish go on the road in New Zealand. If you want to be entertained while seeing the beauty of the country I call home, then I recommend this one.



One feature of the bonus content I've been working on is a playlist. As Blair and Daniel's story takes place in 1990, the soundtrack for it draws from the fabulous music of the 80s. I spent hours trawling through songs from an incredible and diverse era in music. I could only choose 17 which was an extremely difficult task, but I think you'll like the ones that made it because of the way they weave in with the book

chapters.
